Index of Exhibits

A complete index of the exhibits examined in this case is found on pages 1 thru 13 of this consolidated report. Note that an alpha-numeric system was adopted by USACIL technicians to identify the evidence forwarded to the laboratory for processing. The system was devised to assist laboratory personnel in easily identifying the type evidence to be examined (i.e. the letter "D" is the prefix utilized for bloodstains, the letter "V" is the prefix used for fingerprints, etc.), while letter suffixes indicate the location of where the exhibits were found at the crime scene. (i.e. NB-north bedroom, MBRmaster bedroom, K-kitchen, etc.) All evidence in this case was handled in accordance with current Army regulations and accountability records are on file both at the office of the requesting unit and in the administrative and technical divisions of USACIL.

<u>STATEMENT</u>

I, Captain Joel L Leson, 190-34-3035, was Commanding Officer of the US Army Criminal Investigation Laboratory (USACIL) during the period 13 May 1969 to 24 August 1970. During the course of that period, USACIL was called upon to render forensic scientific assistance to Detachment B, 3d MP GP (CI), Fort Bragg, North Carolina, in a case involving Captain Jeffry R. MacDonald, his wife, Mrs. Collette MacDonald, and his children Kimberly and Kristen MacDonald. Initial notification was received by me at 0550 hours, 17 February 1970, from the duty officer, US Army Military Police School that a multiple homicide had been committed at Fort Bragg and that a crime scene processing team was being requested. After confirming this information with Det B, 3d MP GP personnel (CW3 Moser and CW2 R.P. Orrr) I arranged for an aircraft to standby at the Fort Gordon 3d Army Aviation Detachment. At 0730 hours, I briefed the laboratory team composed of CW2 Harold V. Page (Photography), MSG H. O. Medlin (Fingerprints), WOl Ralph T. Turbyfill (Fingerprints), and SP4 Craig S. Chamberlain (Chemistry). At 0820, Colonel Herman Trop, CO, 3d MP GP (CI), briefed the team in a conference call and after this was completed, the team proceeded to Bush Field, Augusta, GA, for air transportation to Fort Bragg.

From the departure of the crime scene team until its return, I maintained daily contact with MSG Medlin (Team leader) in an effort to see if further


support was required from USACIL to personnel at Ft Bragg. Upon the return of the USACIL team on 21 February 1970, all evidence was marked for laboratory identification and processing began.

A de-briefing was given by MSG H. O. Medlin with regard to this case on 23 February 1970. At this time we noted that although crime scene search and processing in the field is not a standard function of this unit, the response provided was both adequate and timely.

MSG Medlin made a number of recommendations regarding contingencies which call for direct support to the field by USACIL technicians. These included the obtaining of coveralls and lab coats stored and ready for issue when such contingencies arise. (This recommendation has been implemented in all divisions of USACIL.) It was recommended that a set of field kits be prepared for each division to expedite "quick response" assistance to the field. (This has been accomplished.) As a result of the extensiveness of this case, additional serology specialists and training in crime scene processing by lab chemists was programmed into the Chemistry Division's program of instruction. A recommendation to insure that all USACIL chemists are prepared for a case such as this, if and when assistance to the field is requested in the future was also made.

To expedite this case a priority was given all evidence involved after its arrival at the laboratory. All results were forwarded after normal laboratory quality control checks and tests were made.

With regard to legal assistance provided by USACIL - both trial and defense counsels were given statements by the technicians involved in the case for the purpose of clarifying their findings and presenting their qualifications.

With regard to this assistance, when approval was granted to conduct a taped interview by Cpt Robert Payne, defense counsel's representative at Fort Gordon, it was agreed that a typed transcript would be provided USACIL to allow for review by technicians being interviewed prior to Article 32 testimony. This was not done. (MSG Medlin was the only examiner interviewed.) Due to the lack of specific questions from defense counsel (civilian lawyers Eisman and Segal) Cpt Payne terminated questioning of other technicians.

As a result of certain allegations made by CPT MacDonald, I additionally provided a verbal statement to LTC Thomas E. Day on 21 December 1970, which explained liaison with the Federal Bureau of Investigations's ID Division, involving the processing of fingerprints by this unit and the FBI. I am certain that every action taken by USACIL in the conduct of this case was correct and in accordance with proper scientific and administrative policy. I am convinced that this unit performed professionally and ethically throughout the conduct of this investigation.





- 49. Appropriate examinations of Exhibits E-1, E-2, E-14, E-15, E-22, E-117, E-124, E-129, E-206, E-211, E-51 MBR, E-59 NB, F-60 and F-115 were performed. These examinations did not reveal any data of significance or relevance.
- 50. Examination of the known hair from Exhibits E-314 through E-319 found same to have different physical characteristics to the hair of Exhibits E-4 and E-5.
- 51. It is the opinion of the examiner that the hair from Exhibits E-314 through E-319 and the unknown hair of Exhibits E-4 and E-5 did not have a common source of origin.

- 52. Examination of Exhibit E-12 revealed the presence of a short human head hair that was grossly similar in all physical characteristics to the known head hair of Exhibit E-305.
- 53. It is the opinion of the examiner that the hair of Exhibit E-12 and that of Exhibit E-305 could have originated from a common source.
- 54. Exhibits E-19a and E-116 contained human body or pubic hair that was grossly similar in all physical characteristics to the known hair of Exhibit E-313.
- 55. It is the opinion of the examiner that the hair of Exhibits E-19a and E-116 could have had a common source of origin with the known hair of Exhibit E-313.
- 56. Examination of Exhibits E-50, E-52NB, E-57NB, E-123, E-221, E-222, E-227 and E-229 did not reveal the presence of any hair grossly similar to the known hairs of Exhibits E-305 through E-313.
- 57. Comparative examinations of the hairs from Exhibits E-4 and E-5 revealed the same to be dissimilar to the hairs from Exhibits E-305 through E-313.
 - a. Therefore it is the opinion of the examiners that the hairs of Exhibits E-4 and E-5 probably did not originate from the same point sources as the hairs of Exhibits E-305 through E-313.
 - b. However, it must be pointed out that the requested opinion regarding positively eliminating the subject as a possible source of the hair Cannot be given without first examining numerous other point sources of body hair from the subject.
- 58. Comparison of wax removed from Exhibits D-123, G-131 and G-201 with the candle wax from Exhibits G(1-10) showed same to be different in chemical composition.
- 59. It is the opinion of the examiner that the wax present in Exhibits D-123, G-131 and G201 did not originate from the candles G(1-10).
 - NOTE: The following findings were forwarded from this laboratory to the requesting agency as an addendum to the basic report.
- 60. The gloves of Exhibit D-245 are surgical gloves. These were received in a sealed package and the gloves were intact.

61. No examinations were performed to see if the pieces of surgical gloves were of the same type as the gloves of Exhibit D-2i5.



- 62. Exhibit L ("Esquire" with red stain on edge): The blood stain appeared to have been made by a person's finger due to it's shape. However, it cannot be positively stated that it was made by a person's finger since definite ridge pattern formation was precluded by the separations of the individual pages. (Reference our Laboratory Report No. P-FA-D-C-FP-R15, dated 2 September 1970.)
 - a. Exhibit E-1 contained particles of nut meats and hulls, small slivers of a pink and silver Christmas tree ornament and dust. No bloodstains were present.
 - b. Exhibit E-3 contained matted yellow paper fibers, particles of mut meats, small round dots of colored paper material and dust. No bloodstains were present.
 - c. Exhibit E-lh contained a small piece of dry vegetable matter, similar to grass or hay. No bloodstains were present.
 - d. Exhibit E-117 contained two (2) animal hairs.
 - e. Exhibit E-124 contained one (1) animal hair and several fibers from the purple green and pink quilt in the south bedroom. No blood stains were present.
 - f. Exhibit E-129 contained several small pieces of dry vegetable matter similar to grass or hay. No bloodstains were present.
 - g. Exhibit E-206 contained several blue, green and yellow single strand nylon fibers grossly similar to the fibers of the rug, Exhibit D-227.
 - h. Exhibit E-211 contained several pink nylon fibers and one (1) animal hair.

- i. Exhibit E-51 MBR contained multi-colored yarns similar to the type used in crocheting. No bloodstains were present.
- j. Exhibit E-59NB contained several small pieces of dry vegetable matter, similar to grass or hay and one (1) animal hair.
- k. Examination of Exhibits F-60 and F-115 showed same to be a small amount of hard yellow and white substance. No chemical tests were conducted on this substance.
- 63. The term, "red crusts" of Exhibit D-256 referred to suspected dried blood. These were not analyzed for anything other than blood type as indicated in paragraph 9 of the Preliminary Report.
- 64. The gloves of Exhibits D-33K and D-34K are not surgical gloves, therefore not identifiable with the suspected pieces of surgical gloves of Exhibits I-3, I-21, I-213 and I-226.
